Foothills Board of Directors election results

On Tuesday, May 4, Foothills Park & Recreation District conducted a mail ballot election for two Board of Director positions, one in Ward 3 and one in Ward 4, featuring three candidates from each ward. The two seats were up for election as the outgoing members, Janet Shangraw and Walt Frankland were term limited.

The first board meeting for the newly assembled Board of Directors will be held on Tuesday, May 11, 6 p.m. at the Peak Community & Wellness Center, 6612 S. Ward Street, when the elected candidates, Judy A. Johnson, representing Ward 3 and John Bradley Jr., representing Ward 4 will be sworn in to begin serving their four-year terms. Current Foothills Board members Jill Nunes, Terri Maulik and Keith Sutton will serve two more years on their current terms.

Executive Director, Ronald Hopp said, “Thank you to all six candidates for 'throwing your hat in the ring' and being willing to invest time and effort to becoming elected to the Board and for your desire to serve your community. Your efforts are admirable and appreciated. I look forward to working with the new members of the Board. Foothills Park & Recreation District, founded in 1959, serves a community of 90,000 residents in a 28 square mile area of unincorporated Jefferson County generally bounded by Hampden Avenue south to C-470 from Sheridan Boulevard west to the Dakota Hogback. The District operates the Ridge Recreation Center, Edge Ice Arena, Lilley Gulch Recreation Center, Peak Community and Wellness Center, four outdoor swimming pools, Indoor Sports Arena, Foothills Golf Course complex, Meadows Golf Course, and 70 park sites totaling more than 2,400 acres and including four regional parks, 42 neighborhood and community parks and 24 greenbelts. In addition Foothills manages six regional trail corridors for public use, which, combined with park trails, total more than 31 miles.
